Discover Phnom Penh 4 days / 3 nights

Day 1 ARRIVAL IN PHNOM PENH (L)

Upon arrival, welcome by the local guide at Phnom Penh airport, transfer and check-in at the hotel.

Note: Rooms are available from 2pm.

Depart for a first discovery of the Cambodian capital including the National Museum and its collection of pre-angkorian and Angkorian Khmer art masterpieces. Lunch at a local restaurant.

Visit the Royal Palace, the present residence of His Majesty King Norodom Sihamoni, and the famous Silver Pagoda. It dominates the city by its impressive architecture and remarkable golden Khmer classical ornaments.

Then walk towards Vat Phnom, the oldest sacred shrine in the city to which the name "Phnom Penh" was derived. Finally, if time permits, stroll through the bustling Central Market famous for its art-deco architecture and the Russian market.

Overnight in Phnom Penh.



Day 2 PHNOM PENH: THE KILLING FIELDS

(B/L)



After breakfast, transfer and visit the Tuol Sleng Museum, a former high school in Phnom Penh which was transformed into a prison during the reign of the Khmer Rouge, where 17,000 men, women and even children were imprisoned, tortured, starved and loaded into trucks like cattle, taken to the Killing Fields at the outskirts of town and killed with a bludgeon blow to the back of the head. Only 7 have survived. Lunch at a local restaurant.

Then, continue to visit the Killing Fields camp of Choeung Ek situated 15 kilometres south-west of Phnom Penh which became famous through the movie of the same name "The Killing Fields". This place is a chilling reminder of the genocide brutalities of the Khmer Rouge regime. In the centre of the camp is a 17-story glass stupa housing 8,000 skulls exhumed from the mass graves.


Then, return back to Phnom Penh in the early afternoon.

Overnight in Phnom Penh.

Note: Both the Tuol Sleng Museum and the Killing Fields camp may be disturbing to some and not suitable for children and adults who are sensitive.

Day 3 THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRYSIDE OF PHNOM PENH

(B/L)



After breakfast, depart for an excursion to Phnom Chisor. Visit the pre-Angkorian Brahmin Temple of Suryagiri (10-11th century) built on top of the hill (503 steps), dedicated to the origins of the Hindu god Suryagiri. Enjoy the breath-taking views over the surrounding countryside. Stop at Prasat Neang Khmau, the temple of the “Black Goddess”, housing a sacred Buddha statue dating back more than 300 years.

Lunch at a local restaurant.

In the afternoon, stop at Tonle Bati Lake and visit the Angkorian temples of Ta Phrom and Yeay Peau (late 12th century). Then return back to Phnom Penh.

Overnight in Phnom Penh.

Day 4 PHNOM PENH- DEPARTURE

(B)

After breakfast, day is at leisure in the capital city.

Note: Rooms shall be released by 12pm (noon).

Depending on the flight schedule, transfer to the airport for the departure flight.
